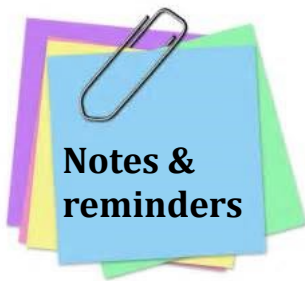
Fun Run done, but pledges can still be collected

The fun run is a great way get kids active and learning, without having to sell “stuff.” This year, the FunRunners used a Super Safari Adventure theme to connect with our students and focus on five character traits: Leadership, Fitness, Courage, Knowledge and Being Yourself.
